

Top 10 Elevation Styles Over the Next Three Years Ranked by Architectural Designers




Indication of How Traditional or Modern Elevations Will Be Overall In The Next Three Years

Top 10 Most Popular Interior Styles over the Next Three Years Ranked by Architectural Designers



Production architects typically provide 2–3 elevation options per floor plan.


Average Elevation Options Provided for Each Floor Plan Designed






When designing full communities, architectural designers are more likely to include additional elevation options to provide a variety of street scene options.

Change to "Elevations Per Floor Plan" Quantity When Designing Multiple Homes for One Community






25% of architectural designers tried at least one new exterior material last year.





Architectural designers most often try new exterior materials to achieve a certain look and feel.


Reasons for Using New Exterior Material(s)





Cementitious materials, vertical board & batten, stone, and engineered wood are being specified more than before.


Share of Architectural Designers Who Included Each in Their Top 5 Exterior Materials Specified More Frequently in 2020, as Compared to 2019





40% of architects are mixing and matching exterior materials more frequently than they were previously.


Frequency of Exterior Materials Mixing and Matching in 2020, Compared to 2019
